- Statement of the problem or topic
- Why it's significant
- What people think to date
- Your take on these different opinions
- Did the class follow your presentation?
- Was the science correct? Is it even a scientific theory (i.e., testable)?
- Were slides and graphics clear and informative?
- Finish with some sort of recap of the problem, and takeaway messages
- Use of AI is fine but make sure it is correct information

Written Report

- abstract at the front, 200-250 words
- Same basics as presentation: Why it's significant, What people think to date, Your take on these different opinions
- Appropriate citations and references to previous work.
- Figures support what you're saying, whether pre-published or original
- Good grammar and proper spelling
- Be quantitative when possible
- Was the science correct? Is it even a scientific theory (i.e., testable)?
- Be sure to come to some sort of conclusion and relate the implications of that back to the larger picture
- Please feel free to use AI to write parts of the paper and then provide a critical evaluation of what the AI got correct and incorrect, and cite sources. You will be graded on your critical evaluation of the AI report rather than the report itself.
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
